

A Boot Needle-Book Design

Based on an Original Pin Wheel



Cut 4 pasteboards w/o seam allowance.
Cut 4 fabrics w/ seam allowance.
Cut 1 batting w/o seam allowance.



Please refer to *Fanciful Utility* by Anna Worden Bauersmith for specific and detailed construction techniques to complete your project.

The original boot pin-wheel appears to have been made with a white or cream velvet bound in red. The same red is used for the embroidered fir stitch.

*For a needle-book, cut your materials using this template. Assemble the front and back according to the directions in *Fanciful Utility*. Connect the boot either at the top using the very tops of the curves (X) or the back using the back curves (V).*

Finish your project with a fir stitch like the original or a stitch of your choice.

For a boot pin wheel, cover two pieces of pasteboard. Place a piece of batting or thick wool fabric between the layers. Attach the layers. Place pins between pieces of paste board into the center.
